# Most Successful Food Pantry Drive since 2014!

St. Mary's Confirmation class participated in the Souper Bowl of Caring in order to collect food for the St.
Vincent de Paul Food Pantry.
Fred Meyer on Kings Blvd. and Market of Choice helped sponsor the event. According to George King, coordinator of the effort, the class collected over 2,000 lbs. of food. In addition, St. Mary's and the community donated \$1,300.

Thanks also to those who contributed through the Pastega Christmas Light Display. Due to inclement weather, donations were curtailed, but we sincerely give thanks for any and all contributions.

In the past twelve months
the number of those seeking
food assistance has increased
by 25%. We serve
approximately 220 households
a month either through the
Food Pantry, or through home
delivery for those who are
housebound or who have no
transportation. We are also
open one Saturday a month to
accommodate those who cannot
come to the Food Pantry
during regular hours.

#### Outreach Provides Needed Assistance

We assist the St. Mary's
Assistance Fund and WE CARE
in fulfilling requests for
help with rent, utilities,
and other bills. These "big
ticket" requests are assessed
carefully and follow-ups are
conducted as time permits.

Our records show that rarely is anyone given assistance more than once a year. Even so, requests for assistance are up 35%.

# Thrift Store Continues Steady Support

The Thrift Store continues to welcome sellable seasonal adult clothing, jewelry, and shoes. Those items that we are unable to sell are donated to Vina Moses, which gives clothing away for free, and to ARC, which has a larger facility. This creates a chain of recycling that benefits us all. The Thrift Store averages \$500 per month in sales. This money goes directly to Outreach and to the Food Pantry. We also donate clothing to Outreach as needed.
